The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is the process given by the Church for the formation of adults in the faith. This is an opportunity for you to share your faith journey with others, to learn about the Catholic faith, and to experience the life of the Church community.

- Entering the inquiry sessions is not a commitment to join the Roman Catholic Church, although it is the process through which persons may be initiated into the Catholic faith. Jesus gently invites each of us, saying to those who are searching, "Come, and you will see."
- We want to welcome you to journey with us and encourage you to bring us your questions and hopes.

Is the RCIA for me?

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is for three groups of people:

- those who are not baptized,
- those who were baptized into another Christian denomination and who wish to enter into full communion with the Catholic Church,
- baptized Catholics who were not instructed in the Catholic faith and who have not completed their initiation through the sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist.
